Members held their Regular Meeting on April 25, 2017 at the Enon Government Center, 363 East Main St. Enon, Ohio.

Also present: Mayor Howard, Administrator Ross, and Chief Wilcox.

Meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

No quorum at meeting; informal session will be held.

Fiscal Officer reported her and Councilman Jeremy Whitacre attended the State Auditors Conference in Columbus and would report back on some news at next meeting when all council is present.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mayor Howard acknowledged the death of lifelong resident Mary Whitacre, mother of Diana McCubbin and grandmother of Jeremy Whitacre. He noted Mrs. Whitacre frequently attended meetings and approved of the direction the village was headed and was very proud of her family members who serve the Village of Enon. The last Tuesday of every month there will a representative for Congressman Davidson between 2:15-3:15 at the village. Saturday night the Honor flight will arrive between 10:15-11:15 p.m., Enon residents will be a part of this flight.

REPORTS:

Admin Ross reported the village has an opportunity to participate in the ODOT winter contracts for the year of 2018. Ross would like to order 100 tons this year for the next winter season. May 10th is the deadline to get paperwork in for this offer with ODOT. Offer tabled for next meeting to have a vote with council members. Recycling stations will be set up at the Mad River Township garage located across from United Dairy. This is a free service and is run by Solid Waste Management in Clark County. The center will open April 26th, with hours from dawn to dusk. Trustee Kathy Estep helped coordinate this service. Gas suppliers and electric co-ops letters have been mailed out to residents, those wishing to "opt out" and not participate must fill out notice and return to provider. The water meters are down to thirty meters to install. Radio read had a few issues and not all meters were able to be read by radio; 70 meters failed to read. The water department will evaluate this issue and repair.

Chief Wilcox reminded the Speedy Freeze will be held on Saturday August 19th at 8 a.m. and the race hopes to have 250 people participating. The department will be getting rid of surplus items on govdeals.com. The police department will be having an intern from Clark State who is majoring in Criminal Justice working with the department for the next month. She will be helping with inventory.

May is motorcycle awareness month; the village is offering free magnets for the look out of motorcycles. Mayor Howard asked the staff to look into the rules pertaining to garage sales and parking on grass, as the village has received several complaints on these issues. It was noted that many communities limit the amount of garage sales permitted in a community each year.
